You have been diagnosed with Inflammatory Bowel Disease (IBD), Crohn's disease or Ulcerative Colitis.

The gastroenterology department, within the hospital, specialises in the care and management of patients with IBD.

This leaflet introduces you to the IBD service and answers some frequently asked questions.

If you have questions not covered in this leaflet, please do not hesitate to contact the IBD nurses.

How will the advice service help me? The aim of the IBD service is to ensure patients are offered the best possible care, treatment and information.

What if I have a flare up in between appointments?

Please contact the IBD nurses or your GP for advice. The specialist nurse may advise you over the phone, or arrange a clinic appointment if necessary.

Please call the IBD advice line if you:

- Have a flare up of your IBD (worsening of your symptoms lasting for 72 hours or more)
- Need advice on your IBD treatment
- Need prescriptions for treatments that are only prescribed by the IBD nurses (such as the first three months of Azathioprine, Mercaptopurine) and not your GP
- Think you are pregnant and have IBD
- Are advise to, by us, following a treatment change or previous clinic appointment
- Have signs of infection and are taking immune suppression or biologic medication for your IBD.

Please do not call the advice line for test results. If any changes to your treatment are required we will liaise with you and your GP. **IBD advice line**: answerphone service Telephone: 01270 273910.
