What is a Gynaecological Nurse Specialist?

This is a nurse who specialises in the care of women with gynaecological cancers and their families. She is a member of the Multi-Disciplinary Team (MDT) which is made up of professionals who are all experts in cancer.

The Gynaecological Nurse Specialists at Leighton Hospital are Sarah Noblet, Susan Slaney and Michaela Onoflo.

What does the service provide?

The Gynaecological Nurse Specialist provides information, education, advice, and support for women, their families and carers from diagnosis onwards. Areas covered:

- Different types of gynaecological cancer
- Investigations and treatment options
- Written information on planned procedures
- · Coping after surgery
- Hospital and community serviced
- Advise on sexual problems
- Referral to specialist services such as lymphoedema clinic and palliative care teams

The Gynaecological Nurse Specialist is able to contact any member of the MDT who are involved in your care.
